Endonuclease Activity (Nicking) - A 50 μ l reaction in NEBuffer 3.1 containing 1 μ g of supercoiled PhiX174 DNA and a minimum of 1 pmol of EnGen® Sau Cas9 incubated for 4 hours at 37°C results in <10% conversion to the nicked form as determined by agarose gel electrophoresis.
